



### THE FOCUS OF AMAZON WATCH'S MONITORING & ADVOCACY PROGRAMS

1. Ecuador: New oil drilling in protected areas of lowland rainforests (Yasuni National Park, Cuyabeno, Limoncocha, Pañacocha).
- b. Ecuador: Campaign for the cleanup of areas where ChevronTexaco operated and dumped contaminants for 20 years.
2. Ecuador: The OCP pipeline route through Andean Montane cloud forests (Mindo Nambillo, Guayllabamba Basin Reserve) will double oil production in the Amazon.
3. Ecuador: Oil exploration by Burlington Resources in Quichua/Achuar/Shuar territories (Blocks 23 & 24) in pristine Southern Amazon rainforest and new proposed oil concessions and exploration (the 9th round) in the territories of Shuar, Achuar, Quichua, Shiwiar, and Zapara peoples.
4. Peru: Camisea gas field and pipeline in isolated indigenous peoples reserve in outstanding Southwestern Amazon rainforest
5. Peru: Contamination cleanup of Block 1AB formerly owned by Occidental Petroleum and prevention of more drilling by Oxy and Burlington in Block 64, in territories of the Achuar people.
6. Bolivia: Bi-oceanic highway and Enron/Shell gas pipelines through Chiquitano Forest (Tropical Dry) and Pantanal Wetlands
7. Bolivia: Pacific LNG gas pipeline to Pacific coast through globally outstanding Chaco dry tropical forest.  
Bolivia: Gas export projects including the new Gasurg and Yabog expansion projects through Chaco forest
8. Brazil: Urucu-Porto Velho gas pipeline near isolated indigenous lands and intact lowland rainforests
9. Brazil: Belo Monte Hydroelectric Dam on the Xingu River to flood tropical forest and impact on indigenous reserve
10. Brazil: Araguaia-Tocantins Industrial Waterway to have an affect on 11 indigenous peoples and upset regional river system
11. Colombia: Oil exploration in the U'wa indigenous territory in the Cordillera Oriental Montane Forest
